Seventeenth meeting of the Occupational Therapy Board of Australia

11 December 2012

At its December meeting 2012 the Occupational Therapy Board of Australia (the National Board) discussed a wide range of matters that relate to its regulatory function within the National Registration and Accreditation Scheme (the National Scheme).

This Communiqué aims to inform stakeholders of the progress in the work of the National Board.

Registration and Notifications Committee – advisory members appointed

The National Board's Registration and Notifications Committee (RNC) is trialing a system of additional practitioner member appointments to the Committee to provide profession-specific advice to AHPRA on registration matters.

The three members who will undertake this role during the trial are:

- Jeannine Milsteed (WA based)
- Rebecca Singh (SA based)

The RNC is grateful for their interest and participation.

Committees of the National Board

The terms of reference for the National Board's delegated committees have been reviewed in light of strategic priorities and developing processes within the national scheme. Board members actively participate in these committees in addition to Board-related work. The National Board's committees include:

- Finance and Governance Committee (Finance and Governance issues and Accreditation issues)
- Communications Committee
- Registration standards, codes and guidelines Committee
- Registration and Notifications Committee
- Immediate Action Committee

Participation Opportunities

The National Board noted that a number of opportunities are currently available for practitioners / community members to contribute to the regulation of occupational therapists in Australia.



• Panel list members – Expressions of Interest

The National Board has extended its call for expressions of interest from experienced occupational therapists and community members interested in being included on an Approved Persons List for panel appointments. Applications from the NT and ACT are particularly invited.

Appointments to the approved persons list are for up to three years, with eligibility for reappointment. The final list will provide the pool from which members are selected should a panel need to be convened.

Recruitment in accordance with s183(2) of the National Law, to the extent practicable, will exclude individuals whose residence or principle place of practice is in a co-regulatory jurisdiction (i.e. NSW).
