

Communiqué

The Occupational Therapy Board of Australia (the Board) is established under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law, as in force in each state and territory (the National Law).

The Board meets face-to-face each month to consider and decide on any matters related to its regulatory function within the National Registration and Accreditation Scheme (the National Scheme).

This communiqué aims to inform stakeholders of the work of the Board.

Stakeholder Breakfast Forum

The March Board meeting was held in Brisbane. The Board started the day with a breakfast presentation for local practitioners on matters relating to the registration standards of the Board. The presentation was well attended and well received by those who came along. Many of the topics covered mirrored those presented in the Board's webinar held last month. Meeting with the Office of the Health Ombudsman

While in Brisbane the Board took the opportunity to meet with Queensland Health Ombudsman Leon Atkinson-MacEwen. Under the new co-regulatory model in Queensland, the Office of the Health Ombudsman (OHO) receives all notifications (concerns or complaints) about a Queensland health practitioner's health, conduct or performance. The OHO determines whether it or the Board should manage the complaint.

The Board and Mr Atkinson-MacEwen discussed the types of complaints the OHO receives and how they are assessed and managed by his office.

Meeting with the Queensland Department of Health

The Board also met with Chief Allied Health Officer Julie Hulcombe from the Queensland Department of Health who presented on the key findings from the Ministerial Taskforce on health practitioner expanded scope practice.

Expert advisors

The Board is conducting a project to recruit expert advisors on various aspects of occupational therapy practice. These areas include:

- Pediatrics
- Driving
- Hand therapy
- Work Health and Safety, return to work and functional capacity evaluation
- Adult rehabilitation
- Mental health
- Home modifications, equipment prescription and attendant care / home services assessments.

The Board notes that grandparenting provisions in the National Law for occupational therapists <u>end on 30 June</u> <u>2015</u>. Anyone who seeks to obtain registration as an occupational therapist under these provisions should make an application as soon as possible.
